D.1 Approval Of The Minutes Of The September 12, 2023 Regular Called Meeting.

Director Shaffer made a motion to approve Item D.1 as presented. Director Norris seconded the motion and it passed with a 5-0 vote.

D.2 Consider A Project Proposal For A Feasibility Study For The Future Use Of 201 Buttercup Creek Boulevard And Authorize Staff To Publish Public Notice And Set A Public Hearing Date.

Deputy City Manager Katherine Caffrey presented a project proposal for a Community Arts Center Master Plan Feasibility Study related to the referenced property. She provided background on the project that included Council strategic goals, resident survey results, property purchase and evaluation of potential arts center concepts.

This project is not included in the Bell District but more focused on a community benefit use. Two 4B Board members, Barbara Shaffer and Larry Norris served along with two Council member, a consulting group and staff in a work group to explore an art center concept.

The results of the conceptual study were presented to Council at the summer retreat and Council asked staff to proceed with the project.

Deputy City Manager Caffrey presented a series of slides to review the work group study results including the site's capacity, arts center concepts, initial programming ideas, integration with Bell Park and the desire to develop an operational model for a 70-100% recovery.

Deputy City Manager Caffrey stressed that all the building concepts and the buildout/programming are very preliminary and subject to further refinement and change. She stressed that the proposed feasibility study would further define the concept.

The cost of the feasibility study is \$264,100 with a timeline of approximately six months. Director Johnson made a motion to approve Item D.2 as presented. Director OBrien seconded the motion and it passed with a 5-0 vote.

D.3 A Resolution Approving An Amendment To The FY 2024 Community Development (Type B) Corporation Budget By An Increase Of \$750,000 Total For The Acquisition Of Real Property Located At 1803 South Bell Boulevard In Cedar Park, Texas.

Assistant Finance Director Erica Solis presented a budget amendment in the amount of \$750,000 for the acquisition of the referenced property. She described the impact on the budget and stated that the funds would come from fund balance.

Director Shaffer made a motion to approve Item D.3 as presented. Director Obrien seconded the motion and it passed with a 5-0 vote.
